

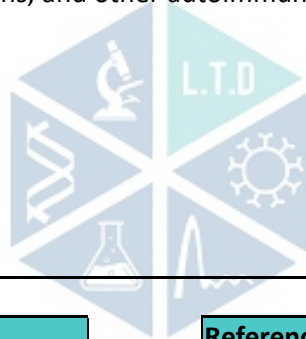
## Anti Nuclear Profile
